- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

At School

The entire Horace Mann faculty and staff will work with students and their families to support student success in the four core subjects, electives and extra-curricular activities in order to build student knowledge, character and success. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Communicate with students & families, at the beginning of the year, course requirements & expectations.
- Design an interactive Back-to-School night for students, parents, teachers and faculty, including information about STAAR testing & test taking strategies.
- Provide parents with ideas and materials in order to help their students with homework.
- Conference times before school, throughout the day and after school to meet with parents to answer questions, discuss concerns and meet needs.

At Home

Horace Mann parents joined to develop ideas about how families can support student' success in the four core subjects, electives and extra-curricular activities.

- Read and check my child's homework.
- Communicate with teachers on how my child is doing and understanding the learning concepts.
- Ask teachers, counselor and/or administration for further explanation on teaching activities, so I can help my child with homework if he/she has questions.
- To the best of my ability, ensure my child gets plenty of rest at night.
- Ensure my child attends school each day and gets to school on time.
- If my child does miss school due to illness and/or doctor's appointments, I will notify the school and send doctor's notes.

Students

Horace Mann students joined staff and parents to develop ideas on how they can succeed in school and reach their greatest potential in the four core subjects, electives and extra-curricular activities. Students included the following ideas:
